1 dozen Ticonderoga Pencils
1 folder your choice (for homework)
1 set of dry erase markers with black/red/blue/green
1 set of colored pencils

A good Pencil bag - A prepared student can be successful and we have found when students can easily keep track of their supplies they are prepared.



The pencil bag must zip and cannot be a plastic box.
